



Gateman-Milloy donates \$50,000 to Innisfree House

- Support for this local hospice continues long after construction completion -

June 1, 2017 – Kitchener, ON – Construction wrapped on Innisfree House in 2015 but the relationship between the hospice and local builder Gateman-Milloy Inc. continues. The construction firm just announced a \$50,000 donation to Innisfree House over the next five years.

“We enjoy many long-term relationships that start with ideas, develop through construction and extend through on-going maintenance and other support,” said Michael Milloy, President, Gateman-Milloy, on presenting the symbolic cheque to Kim Robinson, Executive Director of Innisfree and Lisaard Houses.

“Gateman-Milloy has been a proud partner and supporter of Innisfree through the development and construction period, and now with our property maintenance services. We are thrilled to be extending this partnership to include Lisaard House as well. It is an honour to continue to be associated with a place that provides so much support for so many people in our community and we’re pleased to be able to make this donation.”

Gateman-Milloy invited industry partners, subcontractors and suppliers to provide financial support for the construction of Innisfree House – the Region of Waterloo’s newest palliative care hospice – either through in-kind services or product or price reductions. In addition to financial support for the project, Gateman-Milloy also provided its construction management resources.

The completed facility has earned accolades for Gateman-Milloy, including Community Builder of the Year from the Grand Valley Construction Association as part of its Building Excellence Awards in 2016. The construction firm was also recently recognized by the Canadian Construction Association with the National Community Leader Award, in part because of its work on Innisfree House.

“We are grateful for the ongoing support of Gateman-Milloy,” said Robinson. “Although construction at Innisfree is completed, it is clear they still care about our organization and share a common commitment to serving our community.”

Hike for Hospice

On June 4, Innisfree House and Lisaard House will host their annual Hike for Hospice event at Doon Heritage Village in Kitchener. The event allows families and friends to come together and hike for a great cause, while also having an opportunity to celebrate the life of a loved one they’ve lost. Last year they welcomed more than 400 hikers; for the 2017 event they are expecting even more participants, and have set a goal of raising \$80,000.

“To continue to provide the exceptional level of care that Innisfree and Lisaard Houses are known for we have a very lofty fundraising goal.
